Open Admission Shelters

An open-admission shelter admits every stray and/or surrendered animal from within its jurisdiction. This type of shelter may be legally obligated by a municipal mandate or contract to admit every animal, or it may choose to be open admission according to its own organizational mission and policies. They do not promise to be no-kill and do their best with the limited resources available to them. Open-admission shelters have to make extremely difficult choices. They are responsible for making sure that animals adopted out of their shelter are safe to be in public. Open-admission shelters also have limited space and cannot say no to an animal. At times, they have no more space for animals and again have to make difficult decisions to euthanize based on space alone. *Contact the shelter for the county where the animal was found or where you live, call ahead, and ask about surrender procedures, appointments, and required documentation.*

Lost Pet Help

If your pet is missing, act quickly. Use local recovery help, online lost-pet tools, and microchip resources together.

Lost Pet Tips	Act fast. Start searching right away and post online as soon as possible. Check close to home first. Many lost cats, especially indoor-only cats, stay very nearby and may be hiding within just a few houses of home. Search at dawn, dusk, and late at night when it is quiet. Bring a flashlight, even in daylight, to help catch the reflection of a cat's eyes under decks, bushes, porches, and cars. Look carefully in hiding spots such as garages, sheds, crawl spaces, storm drains, dense shrubs, window wells, under steps, and under parked vehicles. Call softly and listen. A scared cat may not come out, but you may hear movement or meowing. Ask neighbors to check their garages, sheds, porches, and under decks, especially before opening and closing doors. If you have security cameras or can ask neighbors to review theirs, check for sightings. Put familiar scents outside, such as bedding, a blanket, or worn clothing. Do not rely only on food or litter, since food may attract other animals and litter box advice is mixed. Search repeatedly. A cat may stay hidden for days and only come out when things are calm. Post clear flyers nearby with a recent photo, location, date lost, and your phone number. Use multiple tools at once. Post on PawBoost, Petco Love Lost, local Facebook groups, and check shelter lost-and-found pages. Check shelters in person if possible and do not rely only on phone calls or websites. Check the microchip right away and make sure your contact information is current. For shy or indoor cats, think hiding, not roaming. If you are using a humane trap, make sure it is monitored closely and never left unattended for long periods. <i>If you find a pet, report that too.</i> Post found pets online, scan for a microchip, and contact local shelters and rescue groups. Keep online posts updated as lost, sighted, found, or reunited so people know what is current.
